County Council Regular Meeting: March 14, 2017

I. Introduction.

The regular County Council meeting was called to order at 5pm by Council President Dan Brady. Councilperson Yvonne Conwell was absent. The meeting adjourned at 6:00 pm.

II. Antecedents, Announcements and Public Comment.

This observer did not attend the <u>Committee of the Whole</u> at 1 pm, at which the plan for County participation in <u>renovation of Quicken Loans Arena</u> was discussed. The Plain Dealer reported that Council voted 8-2 to move the legislation to sell \$140 million in bonds out of committee, with Schron and Baker dissenting. Schron explained his vote in a PD op ed, urging delay in making long-term agreements until the state budget is published. He noted that voters approved a charter amendment calling for a two-year county budget timed to follow publication of the state's budget, which must be finalized by June 30.

The VP of LiveNation, a Cleveland-based company that books concerts and artists into venues around the country (350 in this market in 2016) spoke in favor of the arena legislation, noting that there is strong competition for high-quality arenas in Pittsburgh, Columbus (2), Detroit and Louisville. Adele Eisman, an elections advocate for many years, questioned the proposed adoption of <u>electronic poll books</u> by the Board of Elections and requested information about related meetings and documents.

County Executive Budish noted that "this is a busy time" and welcomed officials from MetroHealth Systems, which is seeking County participation in the Metro Campus Transformation plan. He also welcomed visitors from Angola and several other South African counries.

At the end of the meeting, several individuals spoke about service provision at the Women's Homeless Shelter.
